The fire started and spread when lit firecrackers fell on a thached roof of a village home. The people of the village attempted to put out the raging fires but could not enter their alley ways due to the fierce strength of the flames. The fire left over 2,000 fishermen and their families homeless. Houses were reduced to ashes within

minutes. The fisherman not only lost their homes but also lost all of their equipment to continue their primary livelihood of fishing. By the grace of God, no one was hurt in the fire.

IREF has been involved in emergency relief in rural villages throughout southeast India for years. Your helping hand to the people on the other side of the world will forever be greatful for your quick response. 2012 Medical Missions Report from the UK Team

Rest and relaxation — forget it! Two hours after arriving in Repalle in February, the medical team was on the move, setting up the clinic in readiness for seeing the first children later that day.




As in previous years, some of the nursing students were allocated to work with us in the clinic. The B.Sc. Nursing programme has around 50 girls in training. It was a pleasure to have a number of the 3rd and 4th year students working alongside the

team throughout our trip. Some of them translated for us very competently, with the additional advantage of clinical understanding. Professionally, we were delighted to have an opportunity to share our knowledge with the students and use learning opportunities when they arose.

Over the course of the week around 700 children, students and adults came through the clinic. The general health of the children was fairly good, though the challenge of skin and gastric infections is ever present.

Overcrowding, especially in the girls' home, has always

been a concern. It was therefore e n c o u r a g i n g to see significant improvements here with now around 20, rather than 40, younger girls sharing each room. For the older girls, there are 10-15 per room.
