Student Testimonials - Bhavani Duppati

A little over 2 years ago, Bhavani enrolled in IREF's Jr College program hoping for an education that would lead to a stable life as well as a way to eventually be the breadwinner for her family. Bhavani is now a 1st year Nursing student at IREF's Nursing College.

When she was about 3 years old, her father jumped into a water-well killing himself. Bhavani's mother worked hard, manual labor jobs to provide for Bhavani and her older sister, Malleswari. The work was hard, the pay not enough. Bhavani's mother, Lakshmi, ceased to think about the well-being and future of her children.

Bhavani's mother was repeated told by her extended family to "get the girls married if she was so worried about them. At least the girls would have someone to take care of them." With limited options, her



mother listened and arranged for Malleswari to get married after she finished her 10th class education, while Bhavani was in 7th class at the time. A few years later, when Bhavani finished her 10th grade, she began to think her sister's fate was also her own as the suggested marriage whispers began again. Standing up to her family, she told her mother she wanted to continue her schooling.

Her mother desired for Bhavani to be in a safe, secure environment where the education was good and she was to be well cared-for if she was going to send Bhavani to pursue higher education. After traveling for 6 hours, Bhavani and her mother mistakenly arrived at IREF, rather than the intended all-girls Jr College, located literally next to IREF's campus. While they had made an error in going to the "wrong" college, God had directed them to IREF. Bhavani and her mother toured IREF's campus, inquired about the Jr College and despite being Hindus, they knew IREF was the right place for Bhavani to be safe and receive a good education. Little did they know how much God was working.

Initially, homesickness set in for Bhavani. She disliked devotions, church, and anything and everything Bible-oriented. As she continued to settle in at IREF, God began to soften her heart. Bhavani witnessed the change in other students who came from similar socio-economic and religious backgrounds. The Lord's voice spoke through the messages at church, and she began to recognize the power of Jesus' name and the desperate need for Salvation. The Scripture that changed her life comes from Luke 5:1-11 – it is the story of Peter, James and John leaving everything to follow Christ Jesus. Bhavani gave her life to Christ through being baptized. She began helping during baptism services, on-campus prayer sessions, devotions and other Gospel-oriented programs.

Bhavani kept her new faith in Christ a secret until her mother came to visit her. Timidly, Bhavani began to tell her how the God of the Bible was molding her heart and how His truth and love was changing her. Her mother strongly voiced her displeasure in Bhavani's being baptism and for "turning her back on Hinduism."

A month after Bhavani's public confession of faith, her mother became paralyzed. The blame was immediately placed on Bhavani and her new found belief in the "Christian" God. With a deep seeking and pleading Bhavani started praying for healing. As sad as Bhavani was, she was also fully active on the prayer team and she was confident that God would hear her prayers. As her spiritual sisters gathered around to prayed with her, a particular Scripture came to mind as she prayed for her mother – 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18: *"Rejoice always, prayer without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."* (ESV translation) God graciously answered Bhavani's prayers – the paralysis went away with no side effects.

"Through what God's Word says for us in how to pray, I was fully-expecting for God to work and bring healing," Bhavani mentioned in talking about her mother's sudden illness. As Bhavani grows in her faith, the Holy Spirit has been working in her mother's life. She has stopped her Hindu worship and other spiritual rituals. While this is a small step, for Bhavani it shows that God is at work in her mother's life. The seeds of faith have been planted and Bhavani is seeing those seeds taking root in her mother's life.

Bhavani's mother realized the importance of education and the benefit for Bhavani in studying to become a Nurse. We are glad to have Bhavani at IREF for her Nursing Program education, to learn more about the saving grace of Jesus Christ and to be a light and example to her classmates on a daily basis. Please pray that the Lord will continue to help her grow in her faith and that her mother will give her life to Christ.
