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

single-parent home. Because of my father's severe alcoholism, my father left our family. My mother works hard to support and provide for us.



On the day I was baptized, my anxiety was overwhelming. When I got into the water, I shivered with fear. For one minute I was silent with tears. I closed my eyes and took in the setting around me. Confessing Jesus as Lord and Saviour of my life, I was dipped into the water. I felt overjoyed and I felt complete in Jesus after I was baptized. My tears of fear turned into tears of joy after I was baptized!

I had the feeling of my sin being washed away and a new life with Christ beginning in me. My name was also changed from Bhagya Lakshmi to Esther which means "star." I truly felt the light of Christ shine from within me.

What would schools be like without notebooks, pencils, or backpacks?

Unfortunately, in Southeast India, many children do not have adequate school supplies. Parents must decide between putting food on the table or buying books and school supplies. The more pressing need of food/survival rightly wins over.

The sad consequence of this is that the children go to school with inadequate or no supplies. Some of them are not able to perform simple tasks like reading from a textbook, taking notes with a pencil, or writing in their notebooks.

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Back in September 2022, IREF introduced the National Cadet Corp (NCC) program, which is an introductory program of the Indian Army. The main values of the NCC program is unity and discipline. Throughout this past academic school year, students (boys and girls) at the high school level engaged in drills, marches, and activities. They have grown in being disciplined and come united as a class group.

Just before the start of this new school year June, the 9th and 10th class students attended a NCC camp where they learned exercises, drill and march practices and other army-related activities. They were taught disciplines pertaining to good behavior, emergency response situations, and other life skills that help their growth and development as a leader. Despite the heat, by God's grace they were kept safe and did well in each of their competitions.

They returned from camp and it was clear that the NCC training had a positive effect on them; their way of talking, posture, initiative has changed. Our hope is that these students will apply the same principles of NCC to IREF's values of education, prayer and discipline.

IREF staff and schools celebrated the 44 NCC students who completed the NCC camp and training. During the assembly, one student urged all the 9th and 10th grade students to join the NCC program because of the impact NCC has had on him.

"I learned a lot from NCC camp. There were different life lessons and practical skills they taught us that will help us inside and outside of the classroom; lesson that will especially help us in society and in our future." - Santhosh (10th grade).

The NCC program provides opportunities to the youth of the country for the purpose of developing discipline and values so that they become able leaders in society. IREF wants to see these young students developed into the next leaders of India.
