#### **Meet Joseph**

Often IREF takes in kids who have no one or who feel like they have no one—no one who quite understands their faith, no one who truly cares for them. Sometimes, we welcome true orphans—kids who might have a story like Joseph.

Joseph grew up near Hyderabad, and as a young boy he lost both of his parents. With no family to care for him, Joseph has lived with two separate pastors—one in Hyderabad who died of COVID and one in Gunter. Eventually his story intersected with IREF after the pastor in Gunter brought him to our school.

Joseph's story is filled with one heartache after another, and his pain is so obvious. As he told his story, he did not hold back his tears. So many kids with painful stories do that; they mask the pain. Not Joseph. Dee pulled him close to herself, touching his arm slightly as she told us, "He is a strong boy."



Joseph is an incredibly strong boy with a painful reality. As Dee told us, he has no one in his life, but at IREF, he



has friends who make him laugh, teachers who care for him, the Rebba family who will fight for him, and a church that pours into him. When we asked Joseph what his favorite verse is, he told us Exodus 15:2. "The Lord is my strength and my defense; he has become my salvation. He is my God, and I will praise him, my father's God, and I will exalt him."

This verse is one of hope, and it's obvious after hearing Joseph's story why this is one of his favorites. Someday, Joseph hopes to be an evangelist. This boy who once had no one will welcome people all over India into the Kingdom, into the family of God.

More than anything, we pray that students will stay rooted in Christ no matter where life takes them.



Before our elementary kids started school break, they participated in VBS at IREF. Natalie Rebba and our VBS team kept the kids active with games, crafts, stories, and action songs. The church was packed with kids expectantly waiting for the next activity as they learned about Jesus.

This year's theme was based on Romans 5:8 and Ephesians 2:10. The kids learned about their identity as children of God, God's plan for our lives as Christians, and the hope of eternity with Jesus. Over the two days of VBS, it was obvious that the Lord was stirring in the hearts of the kids.
